## • Evaluate:

proceed to mounting area

- Risk is a function of both consequence and likelihood. Accordingly, the above ratings should be added together to calculate a total risk rating;
- o The following nominal bands are prepared as a guide:
  - 10 20 Very high risk
  - 21 30 High risk
  - 31 40 Medium risk
  - 41 50 Low risk

## Treatment:

- Controls should be adopted to minimise risk. These include:
  - Key safety plant/personal protective equipment ("ppe"):
    - safety work boots for saddling;
    - saddle and breast plate, bridle, bit, reins, tie-ups, leads all in order;
    - towels and packing OK.
  - Safety checks/hazardous substances:
    - check gear for faults, wear and tear, cleanliness;
    - check ppe.
  - External considerations:
    - weather conditions.
  - Qualifications/experience/training required to complete work:
    - licensed trainer or foreperson with horse handling competency and inducted for correct saddling procedures.

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
